Oshkosh Celebration of Lights Kicks Off 19th Season

Additionally, the Celebration of Lights has introduced a Holiday Smiles Donation Campaign, where a \$5 donation will help provide a holiday experience to a family in need and the Oshkosh Celebration of Lights will pay for the other half.
