Free transportation to VA appointments!

Oshkosh WI, January 23rd, 2025 – The Disabled American Veterans, Chapter 17 transportation program, Winnebago County, in partnership with the US Department of Veteran Affairs, are now offering daily trips to the John H. Bradley VA Outpatient Clinic in Appleton, as well as to the Milo C. Huempfner VA Health Care Center in Green Bay.

DAV Chapter 17 recently received a second van in order to transport Veterans to both Northeast Wisconsin VA locations daily. DAV will pick up Veterans at their residence if they reside in Winnebago County and transport them to the VA free of charge and return them to their residence after their appointment(s). Veterans who reside outside of Winnebago County can utilize DAV services, but they must find travel to one of the pre-determined pick-up locations within Winnebago County. These locations include DOT Park & Ride 70-03 at the intersection of I-41 and Hwy 26, Cenex in Pickett, downtown Kwik Trip in Omro, and the Kwik trip in Winneconne. Please note the DAV network does not offer transportation to Community Care appointments or any other non-VA appointments at private healthcare facilities.

All Veterans with appointments at the VA facilities in Appleton and Green Bay are eligible for DAV transportation as long as they can get on and off the van on their own. Veterans must call at least 24 hours prior to their appointment to book their ride. Veterans can schedule DAV by calling 920-303-2265, ext. 18, and leave their name, details of their appointment, and contact information. Veterans who live within 20 miles of the John H. Bradley VA CBOC should utilize the Appleton DAV services for transportation. Appleton DAV can be contacted at 920-831-7905. DAV is also looking for volunteers to assist in the Winnebago DAV office.
