Oshkosh Area School District Appoints Kelly Skifstad as New Director of Special Education

During her previous tenure with the Oshkosh Area School District, Skifstad collaborated with literacy and math departments to develop professional learning plans, designed a multi-year special education strategic plan focused on co-planning and co-serving students with disabilities, and partnered with principals to improve special education processes and strengthen inclusion efforts.

Skifstad has over 12 years of experience as an educator and five years of leadership in special education. She holds a Bachelor of Science from the University of Wisconsin-Superior and a Master of Science in Educational Leadership from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh.

"I am thrilled to return to the Oshkosh Area School District in this leadership capacity,"

said Skifstad. "My leadership philosophy is service-oriented, grounded in the belief that empowering staff, students, and the broader educational community fosters professional, academic, and personal growth. I look forward to contributing to a district that values equity and excellence in special education."

Skifstad will officially begin her new role on July 1, 2025, following a transition period to ensure continuity of services for students, families, and staff.
