Updates

Pangaea Development of Delafield received city council approval to construct 24 townhomes on various scattered residential parcels owned by the city's Redevelopment Authority on the 100 block of West Ninth Avenue. The nearly \$8 million project proposes two three-story, 10-unit townhouse structures – one located on W. Eighth Avenue and the other on Ninth Avenue – along with two separate two-unit buildings. Each unit will include two bedrooms, 1.5 bathrooms, and attached garage and a private patio.

The Winnebago County Board of
Supervisors shelved conversation on a
potential county sales tax after a motion
to enact a half-percent tax failed to gain
a second from the body, effectively
killing the motion for further discussion
and consideration. Winnebago remains
one of only two of Wisconsin's 72
counties without a countywide sales tax,
the other being Waukesha County.

Wisconsin and US Employment Data

Wisconsin's August unemployment rate held steady at 3.2 percent, the same rate recorded a month earlier, but was an increase from year-ago levels of 2.9 percent. There were 3,043,193 state residents working in August, a sharp decline of nearly 58,000 employees statewide compared with August 2024. The national unemployment rate in August was 4.5 percent, a small decrease from the July jobless rate of 4.6 percent.

City of Oshkosh Employment Data

Oshkosh's unemployment rate for August 2025 rang in at 3.2 percent, up a notch from July and an increase from the August 2024 mark of 2.9 percent. Total employment in Oshkosh for August was 34,202, more than 660 fewer positions from the same time a year ago. Overall, the city's total labor force declined from 35,920 a year ago to 35,315 this past August, a loss of nearly 600 workers.

Winnebago County Employment Data

Winnebago County's unemployment rate for August crept down to 3.0 percent, a one-tenth point decrease from a month earlier, but still up from the 2.7 percent rate recorded during August 2024. Total employment of 89,334 positions across Winnebago County decreased more than 1,700 jobs from August 2024 employment figures of 91,068 jobs. Winnebago County's overall labor force dropped more than 1,400 workers compared with the same time a year ago, from 93,588 during August 2024 to 92,123 workers this past August.

Updates from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce

Government Shutdown

The federal government has entered its sixth shutdown in 30 years, with significant implications for businesses, communities, and the economy. The U.S. Chamber is actively advocating for solutions.

In a memo to U.S. Chamber members, Executive Vice President Neil Bradley addresses two questions about this shutdown.

How might this shutdown differ from prior shutdowns?

- Federal agencies have discretion to determine essential functions, keeping some operations running with staff working without pay.
- Recent appropriations provide the Departments of Defense and Homeland Security with more operational leeway.
- The administration may use the shutdown to implement permanent staff reductions, raising legal and operational questions.
- Thanks to a 2019 law, furloughed workers will be paid automatically once the government reopens.

How long will this shutdown last?

• While far from certain, the political dynamics suggest this shutdown could be on the longer end of the historical norm, possibly stretching to the middle of October.

What we're doing:

Called on Congress and the administration to avoid a shutdown.

Urged U.S. Senators to pass legislation to keep the government open.

Provided a guide for small businesses to navigate the shutdown.

Winnebago County Sales Tax Updates

Winnebago County leaders recently debated a proposed 0.5% countywide sales tax, which was projected to raise around \$20 million annually to ease pressure on property taxes. However, the measure stalled after a resolution to draft the ordinance failed to receive a second at the county board. For now, the idea remains tabled, though supporters argue it could provide a more balanced revenue stream for future budgets. Opponents remain concerned about adding to the tax burden for residents and businesses.


