
READ MORE using parade to get books into the hands of our kids!

This year, we welcomed over 900 students to the Sunnyview Expo Center, where 65 businesses filled more than 85 tables with hands-on, inspiring activities showcasing local career pathways. The event's purpose is to help 8th graders gain exposure and inspiration in what their future might look like so they can begin planning their high school courses to align with their career goals. Relocating to Sunnyview allowed us to host nine student groups, including Omro Middle School and high school students from the OASD system.

Adding to the excitement, students had the chance to explore four oversized trucks, a brand-new rescue boat courtesy of the Oshkosh Fire Department, and a vehicle provided by Bergstrom. 


